PROJECT DESCRIPTION

B.2. Please provide a description of this proposed project, including the needs that it addresses.

The project is proposing to purchase an ambulance. The COVID-19 pandemic has increased the amount of ambulance calls that the district receives. In 2021, the district responded to 5,035 calls for service. In comparison for the year 2020, the district responded to 4,574 calls. This equated to an increase in the demand for our services of over 10% in just one year. So far in 2022, our call volume continues to rise with current responses being 12% higher than 2021. The district would like to increase our ambulance fleet from 4 to 5 ambulances in order to meet the demand caused by the COVID19 pandemic. The district currently staffs 3 ambulances every day with 1 ambulance in reserves. The purchase of this 5th ambulance will allow us the ability to staff 4 ambulances to keep up the demand for ambulance service.

B.3. What are the goals, and outcomes of the proposed project? For example, what is the quantified risk reduction or the number of people who will benefit relative to dollars spent?

- 1. Increase the availability of ambulance service within the community so that we can effectively respond to the COVID19 pandemic. This will be accomplished by increasing the number of ambulances in our community from 4 to 5.
- 2. Increase the safety of the public being transported by our ambulances by providing equipment that provides increased serviceability. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the resulting supply chain shortage, it is not uncommon for our ambulances to be out of service for months due to lack of parts for repairs.
- 3. Ensure that we can maintain or improve our response times to ambulance service requests. Over 36,000 people will directly benefit from this project. This equates to approximately 15% of the population of McHenry County.

Additionally, our ambulance transports over 3,000 citizens a year. Based on a 7 year life span of this equipment, over 21,000 people would directly benefit from the funding. The entire county would benefit as our department has mutual aid agreements for ambulance services with all fire districts in the county.

B.4. Who are the stakeholders involved in this project? For example, who will be affected by this project? What, if any, other organizations are involved?

All residents and visitors within the Woodstock Fire/Rescue District will benefit. The district covers approximately 15% of the population of McHenry County. The Woodstock Fire/Rescue District protects 36,000+ citizens within an 81 square mile response area. Our district includes all or/part of the City of Woodstock, Village of Bull Valley, Village of Greenwood, and Village of Wonder Lake, along with unincorporated areas of McHenry County. In addition, the district ambulances regularly respond to other departments for mutual aid assistance in McHenry County.

There are no unknowns.

Yes. The district will fund the purchase of all "soft goods" needed to supply the ambulances. These include radios, computers, stair chair and IDPH required supplies.

C.4. Describe any available funding alternatives for this project? For example, are there other grants available to fund this project? Are there opportunities to leverage non-County ARPA funds?

There is one alternative funding grant available through FEMA. Ambulances are an allowable project under the "Assistance to Firefighter's Grant" vehicle application. However, historically, less than 200 vehicles are awarded in this grant program for the entire country. The FY21 grant program had \$115 million available for vehicle which included fire apparatus. FEMA appropriated \$11.5 million for ambulances. At an average cost of \$300,000 for an ambulance, this would provide for 39 ambulance awards for the entire country. Therefore it is unlikely the district would secure funding for an ambulance through this program.

There are no known alternatives for this project.

The district's ambulances responded to and treated over 3,000 patients last year. Many of these patients come from underserved communities and vulnerable populations. The district's ambulances are often their first point of contact for medical services. Based on payer mix for January 2020 through June 2022, 75% of patients transported by our district are low income (coverage provided through Medicare or Medicaid). Over 50% of the patients treated by the district's ambulance are age 60 or older. The district encourages those that are treated by our patients' ambulances to provide feedback on the performance of our personnel, training, and equipment via survey or correspondence with management.

This project will serve all citizens and visitors within the Woodstock Fire/Rescue District. Based on payer mix data, approximately 45% of patients served by the district are on Medicaid, and an additional 30% are on Medicare. Additionally, over 50% of the patients treated by the district's ambulance are age 60 or older.

F.2. Please explain how you are making residents or businesses aware of this project and its services.

Residents and businesses are largely aware of ambulance service by dialing 911. In correlation to this specific project, press releases will be sent out via print media and social media.

F.3. What differences are there in access to benefits and services across groups served by this project? Do any groups require supports to achieve equal opportunity to access services?

The COVID-19 pandemic has impacted low income groups and senior citizens. These groups traditionally have relied on ambulance services for transport to the hospital for definitive care.

F.4. Describe any project outcomes focused on closing gaps, reaching universal levels of service, or disaggregating progress by race, ethnicity, or other (related) equity dimensions.

This project will allow us to increase the amount of available ambulances in our district from 4 to 5. As a fire protection district whose ambulance services are accessed by the 911 system, we currently provide universal service to all citizens. However, the increased demand on our service is reaching the point where response times may suffer without an additional ambulance in the community.
