Planned Events:

- Huntley 4th of July was supported by EMA equipment and volunteers to assist with crowd monitoring and command post operations.
- McHenry County Fair. Emergency Services Volunteers supported the event with command post operations, weather observations, and public safety coordination. EMA equipment was used to provide increased public safety and support of MCSO operations.
- EMA hosted a consortium of manufacturers to discuss resiliency in the county.
 This is the beginning of a regular series of planning and networking sessions to assist the county in recovery operations.

Response:

- EMA volunteers assisted Will County with damage assessment after the high impact storms in the middle of July. NWS is reporting 40 tornadoes struck NE Illinois on those two days.
- EMA monitored the effects of the computer outages from the CrowdStrike incident. County systems were not affected; however, numerous municipalities and businesses were.
- EMA staff supported Hebron with a hazardous materials incident in the center of town. Motor fuel had entered the storm and sanitary sewers.

- EMA participated in the plan reviews (Incident Action Plans) for a private music event.
- EMA Staff attended the McHenry County Fair preparation meetings.
- EMA continued to update and modify its "One Responder" and "Resource Inventory Systems" to ensure compliance with latest IEMA / FEMA mandates.
- Chief Deputy Director Loyd and Director Christensen assisted Alden-Hebron Schools with their annual safety review.
- Director Christensen participated in planning for a multi-region hospital exercise.
- Chief Deputy Director Loyd and Director Christensen participated in multiple calls/information/planning sessions in relation to the Democratic National Convention.

 The Search and Rescue Group participated in multiple trainings related to staging, Crew Lead, Alzheimer's, and Autism search ops.


