Clients service in FY24 are 117% higher than in FY23 for the first 7 months of the year. Per Thresholds request letter, the increase in MHB clients is due to both new referrals and post-pandemic Medicaid redeterminations that have disqualified exsisting clients from Medicaid coverage.

As reported in June's ED report, roughly 648,000 Illinoisans have been disenrolled from the Medicaid rolls since the start of the redetermination process. About 2.3 million individuals have had their coverage renewed. Thresholds, as our designated CCBHC, services most of our unfunded (and Medicaid client) in McHenry County and they have reported seeing increases as noted by their FFS data of unfunded clients as well as an increase in overall referrals to them.

## **Change in Medicaid Rates -**

Medicaid rates for some service codes used in Thresholds billings have increased by \$3 or \$7 per unit of service in FY24. As units of service reported for the various service codes vary by month, it is hard to determine the exact impact the rate increase have had on Thresholds FY24 utilization. For the month of June, the increased rates resulted in an additional \$1,644 in payment over FY23 rates. The total amount paid for June FFS was \$48,286.99, 3.4% of the amount billed was due to Medicaid rate increases.

Based on projection and analysis above, the request for \$136,140 in additional funding is reasonable.
