Court Administration (Dept. 42)

Mission Statement: The mission of the 22nd Judicial Circuit of McHenry County is to be the guardian of life, liberty and property to all seeking access to justice, by adhering to practices that ensure equality, fairness and confidence in the judiciary.

Department Created By: Illinois Compiled Statutes (705 ILCS 35/) Circuit Courts Act.

Classification - Judicial

Background: On December 4, 2006, the County of McHenry became the 22nd Judicial Circuit, the judicial branch of government for McHenry County. The 22nd Judicial Circuit is mandated to provide access to all individuals for the purposes of civil, probate, tort, juvenile, family/divorce, minor traffic, criminal misdemeanor and criminal felony litigation.

Functions: MANDATED BY STATE STATUTE

- **Court Administration:** Per 705 ILCS 35/4.1 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, the Chief Judge of each circuit may appoint an Administrative Assistant to assist in carrying out administrative duties in the circuit. The 22nd Judicial Circuit employs a Court Administrator to handle the administrative duties of the courts and other assigned responsibilities in concert with the Chief Judge.
- Jury Commission: Under the direction of the Court Administrator, a list of all Illinois driver's licenses, Illinois Identification Card, and Illinois Person with a Disability Identification cardholders, all claimants for unemployment insurance, and all registered voters of the county is prepared for use in selecting eligible citizens for their civic duty of serving as a juror. The Jury Commission is responsible for notifying all selected jurors, and maintaining a record of the time spent as a juror, and the mileage traveled, in order to reimburse the juror as described by the ordinance of the McHenry County Board.
- Special Courts: Special Courts is composed of the Mental Health Court and the Drug Court. The Mental Health Court is a program designed to serve criminal offenders who are struggling with a mental illness and are currently involved in the criminal justice system of McHenry County. In lieu of traditional punishment, the Mental Health Court diverts defendants away from the criminal justice system by offering alternative court treatment and intensive supervision. The Drug Court Program is designed to serve criminal offenders who are addicted to drugs and/or alcohol through intensive treatment, intensive supervision services with intensive oversight.

<u>Law Library Fund (375) – Funded by Court Fees</u>

Fund Created by: The Board of Supervisors of McHenry County in 1963 per State Statute 55 ILCS 5/5-39001

Classification - Judicial

Background: The Law Library is funded by fees as prescribed and set by Senate Bill 0103.

Function: Under the direction of the Court Administrator, provides access to necessary legal information to attorneys and self-represented litigants.

Special Courts Fund (376) - Funded by Court Fees

Fund Created By: McHenry County Board Resolutions R-200605-90-144 (Mental Health Court) and R-201004-41-091 (Drug Court)

Classification - Judicial

Background: The Special Courts Fund is composed of three specialty courts; the Mental Health Court, the Drug Court, and the Domestic Violence Court. The Mental Health Court is a program designed to serve criminal offenders who are struggling with a mental illness and are currently involved in the criminal justice system of McHenry County. Program funding is through a fee to be paid by defendants upon judgment of guilt or grant of supervision under Section 5-9-1 of the Unified Code of Correction on all felony, misdemeanor, petty and business offenses. The Drug Court Program created by the McHenry County Board in accordance with Illinois State Statute 730 ILCS 166/15(a) states that the Chief Judge of each judicial circuit must establish a drug court program including the format under which it operates under the Drug Court Treatment Act. Program funding is through a fee to be assessed on a judgment of guilty or grant of supervision for a violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code or a violation of a similar provision contained in a county or municipal ordinance committed in the county, or on a judgment of guilty or a grant of supervision under Section 5-9-1 of the Unified Code of Corrections for a felony; for a Class A, Class B, or Class C misdemeanor; for a petty offense; and for a business offense committed in McHenry County.

2024 Highlights

- Fully implemented the Guardianship Accounting Program (GAP) which was internally designed by the Court to aid guardians in the filing of financial and asset reports with the court. This system provides better reporting and aids in protecting wards from financial exploitation.
- Upgrading and completing the JuryPlus software within the Jury Commission to better manage and communicate with jurors, which would include the ability to communicate with jurors via text and email. It will also allow prospective jurors to answer questions online, negating the need to send qualifying affidavits back to the Jury Commission.
- Implementation of the SAFE-T Act provisions.
- Successfully submitted two SAMHSA, one IDOT, one McHenry County Community Foundation, and a Mental Health Board Grant. We were awarded \$75,000 through the McHenry County Community Foundation for an employment specialist, awaiting final approval of funding for IDOT, and pending approval of the SAMHSA grants.
- Hosted an open house for public officials as well as the public to tour the judicial center and learn about several different services provided by the County.
- Held multiple graduations for Mental Health, Drug, and DUI court clients to celebrate their completion of the Specialty Court Programs.
- Completed Recidivism Study of the Office of Special Projects Mental Health, Drug, and DUI Court Programs and provided a presentation to the McHenry County Board.

2025 Goals

- Complete Phase II of the Specialty Court Program evaluation to identify correlations between new offenses, recidivism and services provided while in the program.
- Update the Self-Help Center and Law Library space for an enhanced client experience.
- Complete comprehensive analysis of caseload, court assignments, calls, to ensure the court is appropriately assigning resources based upon present demand.

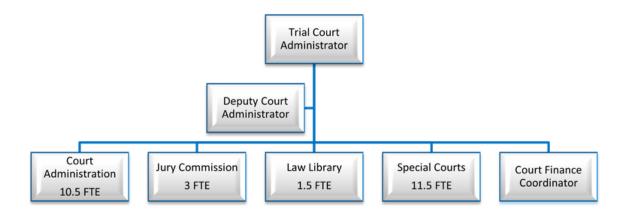
