Collecting Payments Data from OpenGov Permitting & Licensing

How much are you receiving from permits, licenses, and inspections paid for in OpenGov?

From finance teams and department heads to City Councilmembers and auditors, many stakeholders require summary reports of the total revenue received from the transactions completed in OpenGov Permitting & Licensing.

There are three ways to pull OpenGov payments data in CSV format:

- 1. **From your government's Stripe portal,** you can pull Payout reconciliation reports for online payments. This data will include metadata from OpenGov as well as the Payout Date of each transaction. Note: The Payout Date is the date that funds were deposited to your bank account it is not equivalent to the Date Paid, which is the date that the customer completes the transaction in OpenGov. <u>See instructions here</u> and here.
- 2. From Explore reports in OpenGov Permitting & Licensing, you can find data for all payments made (online and offline) that is updated in real-time. As detailed here, the Ledger Report will provide you with attributes like the Date Paid, Fee Label and associated (General Ledger) Account Number, the payment Method, and other information. The Payments report can also be pulled to identify transaction fees. Payout Date is not included in these data views under Explore reports.
- 3. From our Accounting & Financial Export, your finance team can define a custom query of payments data from OpenGov Permitting & Licensing that will be exported in the form of flat files on a nightly basis and sent either to an email address of your choice or an FTP site managed by either OpenGov or your IT department. The data export can be fully comprehensive of payments, refunds, and transaction fees. Columns of data we can include in the Accounting & Finance Export are listed here and on the next page.
